Job Summary:

The Teaching Artist is a leader, educator, and collaborator for all youth development programs at CCAE Theatricals, supporting and advancing the organization's mission through a variety of teaching opportunities. While Camp ¡Exprésate! is our flagship Creative Youth Development (CYD) program and likely to have the most opportunities for Teaching Artists, this position encompasses all educational programming, including workshops, masterclasses, and other CYD initiatives. Teaching Artists design and deliver engaging, high-quality programming that spans disciplines such as acting, singing, dance, design, and technical theater.

At Camp ¡Exprésate!, our Teaching Artists collaborate to implement a curriculum based on CYD principles: Artistic Expression, Youth Empowerment, Collaboration & Community Building, and Holistic Development. Teaching Artists play a pivotal role in fostering safe, inclusive, and accessible environments where youth can thrive, express themselves creatively, and build confidence.

Camp ¡Exprésate! operates afterschool as well as during spring, summer, and fall camps.

Responsibilities:

- Develop and deliver arts education lesson plans tailored to your area of expertise (acting, singing, dance, design, or technical theater).
- Collaborate with program staff and other Teaching Artists to ensure cohesive and impactful programming.



- Create supportive environments where students feel encouraged to express themselves and take creative risks.
- Adapt lessons to accommodate varying skill levels and learning styles.
- Promote social-emotional learning outcomes, including confidence, collaboration, and self-expression.
- Provide constructive feedback to students while celebrating their progress.
- Attend training sessions, weekly check-ins, and pre-program planning meetings.
- Arrive punctually and prepared for all sessions, ensuring effective setup and cleanup as needed.
- Communicate openly with program staff to address challenges and share successes.
- Provide supervision outside of the classroom in camp and other educational settings, ensuring the safety of all campers and staff.

- Expertise in one or more disciplines: acting, singing, dance, design, or technical theater.
- Experience teaching or working with youth in educational or community settings.
- Strong commitment to fostering diversity, equity, inclusion, and belonging.
- Exceptional communication and classroom management skills.
- Flexibility, creativity, and a collaborative mindset.
- Bachelor's degree in a related field or equivalent professional experience is preferred.
- Ability to teach effectively with a classroom ratio of up to 20 students per instructor.

- Experience working with students from diverse backgrounds, including those with intellectual and developmental disabilities.
- Familiarity with Creative Youth Development principles.
- Bilingual proficiency in Spanish and English is a plus, but not required.
